5th July PDQ3 Away vs. Gt Horkesley

Boxted 2nd elevens' best performance of the season so far saw them run out easy victors against local rivals Great Horkesley. Batting first good knocks from Tim Bellamy(61), Clive Honey(59), Pat Gilbert(37) and Jon Wilson(42 not out) saw a good total of 218 for four wickets at innings close. Horkesley were never in it against good tight bowling and excellent fielding and were all out for 129 and 89 runs short with Paul Dowde (6 for 51) the pick of the bowlers.
